Click <b>Take Sample Tests</b> from link above</li> <li>2. Once in the <b>Sample Tests Sign In</b> Portal Make sure Guest User is in the <b>ON</b> position</li> <li>3. Then click blue <b>SIGN IN</b> at the bottom</li> <li>4. Choose student's <b>GRADE</b></li> <li>5. Choose <b>Test</b> to practice on</li> <li>6. <b>Writing-</b> students will write rough draft and type final draft in this portal. The use of reading material to support their writing is important to note. They will also benefit from practicing the <b>online dictionary and thesaurus.</b></li> <li>7. <b>Reading-</b> students will answer multiple questions using various types of reading passages.
