
Mr. Tauscher is married to his wife Lauren of 17 years who works as a school administrator for the Phoenix Union High School District.

Eye on Education

Using devices in the classroom can be distracting to students and lead to lower grades.

A study published in the journal Educational Psychology found that students who had cellphones or laptops present while a lesson was being taught scored five percent, or half a letter grade, lower on exams than students who didn't use electronics.

Researchers separated 118 college students enrolled in the same course into two groups. Each group was taught the same material by the same professor, but one group was allowed to have cellphones and laptops open for nonacademic purposes. while the other group was not. While the students allowed electronics didn't score lower comprehension tests during lectures, thev scored lower on exams at the end of the term.
